Opening Remarks - George Fields

- 1. Call to Order
 - a. Hello everyone and welcome to our sixth senate session of the 2021-2022 academic year. Thank you for being here today.
 - b. We have some exciting bylaw and constitution changes to go through, at least 30 senators have contributed.
 - c. We have some confirmations to do today as well.
 - d. Raise your hand if you wish to be acknowledged. For those on zoom, please raise your hand and one of the moderators will notify me so I can acknowledge you. Once you have the floor, you may speak. Always introduce yourself with your name and voting number so that we can make note in the meeting minutes.

- 3. Introducing Dr Frank Cuevas, Vice Chancellor for Student life to give some remarks.
 - a. Wanted to come in and let you know we're very appreciative for you and the work you do, whether it be in a classroom, research, or in courses.

- b. We are always wanting to support our graduate students and graduate student families.
 - Discussing housing for graduate students and international students.
 - ii. Considering partnering with private housing companies to provide housing at an average rate for Knoxville.
- c. Hunter is a good conduit to bring concerns to me, as well as Dr. Dixie Thompson. They are both strong advocates for graduate students.
 - We know the needs of graduate students are different than undergrads.
 - ii. Currently holding a grad student fair in the building, with a number of students we are recruiting.
- d. We really want to get a sense of what graduate student concerns are and address those.
- e. GPSAW coming up
- f. Milkshake Monday focused on grad students coming up
- g. Appreciate your work, I have been in your shoes, it's hard but necessary work to keep this operation running.
- 4. Now I will reintroduce our President, Hunter Hammock, for the President's Report.

President's Report - Hunter Hammock

- 1. Hello everyone. Thank you for being here.
- 2. I am thankful for your participation and support.
 - a. We're grateful to have you serving the graduate student body.
- 3. Today we will be focusing on the Bylaws and Constitution
 - a. Biggest update we have is the constitution and bylaws revisions. We have spent countless hours working on the document, exec committee, legislative steering, and over 30 senators have provided edits and suggestions as we have crafted this document.
 - i. George has put in an extraordinary amount of work. He will provide the details of the document and the proposed updates.
 - ii. I feel that this document is in excellent shape. The majority of updates include grammar and syntax, removal of old verbiage. A handful of key updates that were much needed and will serve GSS well. Looking forward to George's presentation.
- 4. Senator survey is forthcoming and will greatly assist as we finish up resolutions drafts.

- a. Because of our unique and dynamic situation this semester, we will be sending out another senator survey to help us further identify common issues that continue to plague our students, as well as uncover new issues that may have arisen within the last few months.
- b. This will also be an opportunity to introduce any new ideas, as we will begin to introduce a number of resolutions over the next few weeks.
- c. Dean Thompson survey for student's along the same vein.
- 5. Planning an awards ceremony for GPSAW week, a great way to recognize and appreciate our hard-working students. Nominations and details are forthcoming. We will begin promoting the event in the next week or two.
 - a. April 6th at 5:30 at Tennessee Terrace at Neyland Stadium.
- 6. 5K river run/walk fundraiser for the GSS event fund and Big Orange Pantry.
 - a. April 9th at 10am at Cherokee park.
 - b. We encourage all UT faculty/staff/students and Knoxville community members to join and participate.
 - c. 30 dollar registration and we ask that you bring food or other "food bank" based items that can be donated to the pantry.
- Our committees are working on resolutions regarding issues important to our senators, including for stipends, mental health, UTK providing students PReP medication for HIV prevention, 360 advisor feedback, and a handful of other issues.
- 8. Priority on connecting with the faculty senate and SGA moving into next year, we would like to assign reps to each group to facilitate communication and coordination.
- 9. Town hall planning in the works, details forthcoming.
- 10. Travel awards and academic support awards still available, please take advantage of these opportunities. Market these to your department.
- 11. Equity and Diversity will be hosting professional more development, we heard great things from the salary negotiation seminar. Working with faculty senate and SGA on coordinating efforts.
- 12. Looking to make connections with other SEC university student governments to learn and share.
- 13. Recruitment has been going well, still adding numbers, high rate of turnover as each department has different terms of service for senators.
 - a. We are going to focus on recruitment for the next year moving into the upcoming months.
- 14. One last comment, when Mohamed and I were elected, we knew that social connection and stipends were high on the list of priorities.
 - a. We quickly found out that our major calling was to set up GSS for success for many years to come. For the next 5, 10, 15, 20 years.

- b. The timing is perfect to pass our amendments for constitution/bylaws, and we are in the final stages of the GSS coordinator search process, so they will be established before we leave office and we can provide GSS a strong footing for the next set of leaders. And set GSS up for success for many years to come.
- c. Elections are drawing close, and if you are considering running for office, I highly encourage you to come talk with us about the process and details about the available positions. It is a major time commitment but very rewarding to help our fellow students.
- 15. Overall, great news from GSS. Things are going smoothly and I am very happy with the progress we've been able to achieve.
 - a. Looking forward to finishing up the spring semester and setting up GSS for continued success.
 - b. I am so proud of all that our senators and committees have been able to accomplish over the past few months.
 - c. I want to give a heartfelt thank you for your service. All of the graduate and professional students are grateful for the work we have done.
