President's Report

- Thanks for being here for this special session.
- My remarks and this meeting will be brief because today's focus is on our votes and finishing out the year on a strong note
- Voting is critical today to send a strong messages to the University on two fronts
- Housing and a thank you resolution
- Housing remarks
 - I want to thank lufuno and the e/d committee for their work on this
 - Took a hard look at the published literature and stats to build this document
 - Housing is a major issue in knoxville, especially for first time grad students, international

- We are currently at a crisis point, many students will struggle to secure housing unless major efforts taken immediately
- We cannot afford to lose talent to secondary schools or other SEC universities because we do not have affordable housing (or even physically having the space).
- This is a critical and timely resolution, and we appreciate your support.
- Document was passed to Justices, Exec committee, GSS coordinator, and graduate school for review and revision; all parties gave the green light.
- Current version (as distributed) has not received any additional revisions.
- I will let Lufuno make additional comments regarding the resolution before we open for discussion/vote.

TY Resolution remarks

- I am very proud of the thank you resolution
- George will speak about the details further as sponsor
- o I would like to discuss background and how this came to be
- This groundbreaking decision is the culmination of advocacy work done by dozens of students, staff, and faculty over the course of many years, at least 5 years in the making.
- It will help to address some of the financial challenges that many current graduate and professional students encounter during their time on Rocky Top and make us more desirable to potential students.
- Huge win in addition to the 2.5 mil acquired over the last 5 years for stipends as well as the one time fellowships that dean thompson was able to distribute this semester.
- Want praise Chancellor Plowman for the reallocation of university funds to make graduate education more accessible to students with full-time assistantships.
- I have seen all of the work behind the scenes to actually make this happen —
 arduous task of reallocating funds to cover these fees for students has been in
 the works for many years now, and this semester was when things finally came to
 fruition.
- This resolution will send a strong message of unity that our grad students support this decision and encourage further actions to improve our graduate student finances.
- It also reinforces our desire and drive to continue to advocate for our university to utilize all available options in order to financially support graduate and professional students.
- We will continue our efforts to combat increasing food, housing, and basic need insecurity on campus.
- Was passed to Justices, Exec committee, GSS coordinator, and graduate school for review and revision
